WNCSB (also known as Serve Wisconsin), is a 21-member citizen body appointed by the governor. Serve Wisconsin, housed at the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, is attached to the Wisconsin Department of Administration and currently has a five-person staff.

The mission of Serve Wisconsin is to promote, train and allocate resources to programs that enrich lives and communities through service and volunteering. Presently, Serve Wisconsin provides funding for the kickoff and end-of-year celebrations as well as hosting quarterly program director meetings and a statewide service conference.

Serve Wisconsin supports service in Wisconsin primarily by granting AmeriCorps funds from the Corporation for National and Community Service to organizations that involve citizens in service activities while also meeting human, educational, environmental, public safety and homeland security needs.
