



## Online Volunteer Recruitment: Where Can You Post for Free?

Maximize reach by posting your needs on as many websites as appropriate. Use this comprehensive list to be sure you have all of your virtual bases covered. This list is divided into seven categories for your convenience.

### Websites for Posting Any and All Types of Volunteering:

- [www.allforgood.org](http://www.allforgood.org)  
**All for Good** is a hub for volunteerism and a service of Points of Light. It serves as a meeting place for large and small nonprofits and individuals to see where change is needed, and makes it easy for them to engage. All for Good helps facilitate service day projects on MLK Day and 9/11 Day of Service and Remembrance.

**Serve.gov** is managed by the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS), the federal agency charged with promoting and fostering volunteering and national service in America. Serve.gov aims to engage new volunteers in the work of CNCS and encourage volunteers to develop their own "do-it-yourself" projects.

**Craigslist** allows free postings of all types of classified ads. They have a category noted as "Volunteers." It's a good option for posting about special events or one-time opportunities.

**Facebook** allows you to post volunteer opportunities on your organization's page and encourage friends and current volunteers to share posts. Used by 79% of online adults.

**LinkedIn** for Nonprofits helps organizations search for both volunteers and potential employees, as well as help connect individuals and nonprofits. A good source for recruiting skills-based volunteers.

## Social Media (Cont.):

**Twitter** can reach potential volunteers through hashtags (particularly useful for Days of Service and special events) and to create a buzz about upcoming opportunities. Used by 24% of mostly college-educated adults.

**YouTube** allows organizations to post videos to recruit volunteers or to showcase your organization's volunteer program. One of the social media sites with the greatest representation of diverse populations, it is used by 63% of online adults and steadily growing.

**Instagram** engages with volunteers through a new medium and showcases daily activities and fun projects with pictures. By posting pictures of volunteers in action or engaging with clients, they can resonate with potential volunteers. Used by over half of the 18-29 year old population.

Tumblr uses a blog format to share text, links, videos, and photos with online users. Share stories and testimonials using a variety of media to attract potential volunteers. Popular with high school and college students.
